Box 114000, 201 Criser Hall, Gainesville, FL 32611-4000. COPIES OF TRANSCRIPTS and TEST SCORES must be sent the Dept. of Nuclear and Radiological Engineering, P.O. Box 118300, along with the department copy of the application, letters of recommendation, purpose statement and any other material.

When available, financial assistance takes the form of a graduate assistantship, and can be accompanied by a waiver of matriculation fees. The student is expected to pay those fees that cannot be waived. **The enclosed Application for Graduate Assistantship should be returned directly to me.**

Your application will be acted upon as soon as all the requested forms, letters, and test scores are received.
